The world road transport organisation

IRU is the global voice of companies providing commercial road transport, mobility and logistics services.



Impact of COVID-19 on road transport sector

The road passenger transport industry has to cope with a revenue loss of **-51% equal to 447 Bn€ in 2021**

The road freight transport industry has to cope with a revenue loss of **at least -13% equal to 286 Bn€ in 2021**



Transport connectivity as basis for economic growth

Connectivity is a cornerstone of regional economic cooperation and integration

Particularly in the context of fastest economic recovery after the pandemic

And for finding new drivers of regional economic growth

Need for reinforcing intra and interregional trade and transport connectivity

- to facilitate export
- to satisfy growing demand in import


